- **SOAY SHEEP** ▶

are one of the oldest domesticated animals known to man and are now quite rare. Native to the St. Kilda group of islands west of the Outer Hebrides.

- **CLUN FOREST SHEEP** ▶
- are an old breed of sheep from Shropshire in Northern Wales, introduced to the US with migrants from Nova Scotia.
